A. _____: where we get the word porno as in pornographic literature. It refers to illicit sexual activity of all types; whether it be within the context of marriage or outside the bonds and the guidelines of a biblical marriage.

- B.** _____: refers to physical and moral uncleanness and filthiness. It refers to values, manner of speech, and personal hygiene.
- C.** _____: a passion for evil; that which is ungodly. It speaks of a drive or a force that does not rest until it is satisfied.
- D.** _____: this phrase takes the previous item to another degree even more dreadful; what happens when ungodly passion goes downward to another level and the meaning is even broader than the previous word.
- E.** _____: refers to insatiable selfishness; greed. The greedy desire to have more and more and more.
- F.** _____: an abiding, settled, and habitual action that includes revenge. It is either saying the words or thinking them passionately “I wish you were dead” or “I could kill you.”
- G.** _____: Burning anger; intense anger. The kind of sudden violent anger we might see manifested in a fit of road rage.

- H.** _____: the vicious nature of a person who is bent on doing harm to others. It is a desire for ill will and/or injury.
- I.** _____: speaking evil; doing what you can do to cause a person to fall into disrepute or cause them to have a bad reputation.
- J.** _____ **language**: shameful speaking. It refers to a low or obscene speech. Filthy talk; dirty speech; abusive language. Speech that is shameful and disgraceful.
- K.** _____: story telling; fictitious conversation; embellishing of stories.
